

OPGC Kicks Start ₹11.5k-Cr Expansion

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The expansion project of 2x600 MW thermal power plant (Units 3 and 4) of Odisha Power Generation Corporation (OPGC) has been put on the wheels with the issuance of work order in favour of BHEL and ECL Energy Systems Ltd (ECLESL).

The total expansion work involves an estimated cost of ₹11,500 crore.

As mentioned, in the initial statement, the equipment design basis report, engineering drawings, turbine buildings and boiler building details for foundations, mill and backup buildings fabrication, drawings for supply and erection of the main plant as per the scope of the tender will be taken up by BHEL and establishment of labour camps like levelling and grading, cement batching plant, turbine building and boiler foundations and equipment design basis report, engineering drawings for all the ancillary... And... peripheral plants will be completed by ECLESL.

This will be followed by no-

jar construction work targeting the commissioning of the units in the 12th Plan period, an OPGC official released said.

OPGC had signed contracts with BHEL and ECLESL on April 27, and July 11, 2013, respectively, for the award of work for the main plant (MTP) worth ₹4,000 crore and the balance of plant (BOP) worth ₹1,500 crore.

"It is worthwhile to mention here that the above cost taken together works out to about ₹11,500 crore per MW (from price to ECA without any risk of foreign currency exchange variation) which is by far the cheapest of the bids finalized in the power sector till for 600-MW plant configuration," the released said.

The OPGC expansion project had secured financing tie-up with Power Finance Corporation (PFC) and Rural Electrification Corporation Ltd (REC) in November 2012.

Of the total cost, the PFC and REC will fund ₹1,000 crore each of the project costly in a 30/30 ratio on a long-term basis to be recovered over a period of 30 years, while OPGC will contribute equity.
